Applicants must:

- Be between 18 and 35 years old by December 2025.
- Demonstrate a clear commitment to social and environmental change.
- Have proficiency in English.
- Show leadership potential in sustainable development.
- Reside in any African country.

Program Commitment

Fellows must:

- Fully participate in virtual sessions, assignments, and impact projects.
- Dedicate 8-10 hours weekly for three months.
- Maintain regular communication with program organizers and peers.
- Participate in surveys and provide feedback during and post-program.

Technical Requirements

The fellowship will be conducted **virtually**. Fellows need access to a computer or mobile device with internet connectivity.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. What is the SELA Fellowship?

The Sustainable Education and Leadership for Africa (SELA) Fellowship is a virtual program under the African Youth Mentorship Project. It helps young Africans become sustainability leaders by equipping them with the skills to start, grow, or improve their grassroots initiatives, NGOs, or social enterprises.

2. Who can apply for the fellowship?

People who want their sustainability career or initiative or impact career or are confused and want to start their career. Applicants must be between 18 and 35 years old, demonstrate a commitment to improve their communities through continuing to run or starting their initiatives, have proficiency in English, and reside in any African country.

3. How long does the program last?

The fellowship runs for three months, requiring 8-10 hours of commitment per week.

4. Is the fellowship conducted online?

Yes, the fellowship is fully **virtual**, and participants will need access to a computer or mobile device with internet connectivity.

5. What are the benefits of joining the SELA Fellowship?

Fellows gain skills in starting their sustainability projects, NGOs and social enterprises.

6. Will I receive a certificate upon completion?

Yes, fellows who successfully complete all requirements including a successful outreach project will receive a certificate of completion.

7. Is there a participation fee?
